1. **2025 Toyota Camry**

Starting price: \$29,835

Combined fuel economy: 51 mpg

2. **2025 Honda Accord**

Starting price: \$29,445

Combined fuel economy: 32 mpg

3. 2025 Honda CR-V

Starting price: \$31,495

Combined fuel economy: 30 mpg

4. 2025 Kia Telluride

Starting price: \$37,805

Combined fuel economy: 22 mpg

5. 2025 Toyota Sienna

Starting price: \$40,635

Combined fuel economy: 36 mpg

The lowest-priced car on KBB's list is the 2025 Honda HR-V, ranking No. 8 and starting at \$26,795.

As for electric cars, KBB recommends the 2025 Hyundai Ioniq 5, which ranks No. 9 on the list and starts at \$43,975.
